[1] Students whose primary Applied Music is voice or an instrument other than piano shall complete Piano Class 106 or the PCL 106 examination.
[2] Students must register for eight separate courses (1 or 2 units) in large ensemble, chamber music performance, and/or accompanying. At least two of these course registrations must be selected from ENS 100, 120, 120A, 120B, or 120C. Up to two registrations of ENS 215, 216, or 260 may be included; more than this requires permission of the academic advisor.
[3] See Academic Policy Handbook for information concerning electives.
[4] See Reverse side for requirements. Students may not use the same course to fulfill both Theory Elective I and Theory Elective II. Note that 400level courses require permission of instructor, and 500 -level courses may be taken by undergraduates by special permission of department chair only. These theory electives fulfill the required upper-level music theory or music history elective at or above the 200-level for this major.
[5] Prerequisite for TH 285: TH 220 (Musicianship and Analysis 4)
[6] Prerequisite for TH 295: TH 285 (Comprehension and Analysis)
[7] Music History classes do not have to be taken together in chronological order. Students may begin to take MHS 120s starting their sophomore year. Students must complete MHS 121, 122 and 123 before enrolling in a 200 level MHS course.
[8] Students who place into TH 100/105 will start the Theory sequence in fall of their first year and are not required to take TH 230. Students who place into TH 110/115 begin the Theory sequence in the spring of their first year and will continue through TH 230.
[9] Registration for additional unit required. Students must earn a minimum of 120 units to receive a B.M. degree AND must carry a minimum of 12 units each semester

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[^0]:    Important things to remember:
    Variations from the prescribed program of study should be approved in advance by the appropriate Eastman department and appropriate documentation must be on file in the Registrar's office.

    Bachelor of Music students must complete eight semesters of full-time, college-level study earning no fewer than 120 units. Students must be registered for 12 units each semester to be considered full-time. Students who earn advanced standing in any subject must complete an equivalent number of optional elective units toward their required total degree units.

    Upon receipt of an official transcript, a maximum of six college-level units with a grade of B- or better may be used as transfer unit after matriculation.
    All Bachelor of Music students must complete FWS 121 plus 20 additional units of Humanities \& Sciences courses of at least 4 units each. Any course over 4 units must be approved by the Humanities Department Chair. In some majors (voice and theory), required language classes count toward this requirement.
